PASSAGE: Genesis 5 & 11 'Genealogy Marathon'

THEME/S: Genealogies of Messiah

2. How far back do you know your genealogy?

Genesis 5

3. What does your name mean? Consider & discuss the names from Shem to Noah:
 - Some names speak to the circumstances of their birth or the situation in the world at the time and others are prophetic.
 - Some have highlighted that these names one after the other make a gospel statement.
4. Enoch was the first person in scripture to be raptured. What was the defining characteristic of Enoch's life?
5. What does it mean for us to 'walk with God' as Enoch did?

Genesis 11:10 – 32

After the Babel rebellion, nations spread out and we see that lifespans were shortened. The genealogy narrows down to the line of Messiah from Shem to Abram. From this point on we will focus in on the life and times of Abram and his family.

6. What key things do we learn about Abram's life situation in these verses?
7. Why does the Bible set out the line of Messiah in such detail?
